FIRST STANDISH COUNCILLOR IN 50 YEARS IS MAYOR

The first Standish councillor to be a Mayor of Wigan for more than 50 years has begun her term in office and is inviting you to her civic service at St Wilfrid's Church.

Councillor Debbie Parkinson was Deputy Mayor last year and stepped up to the top job at a ceremony in Wigan Town Hall with her official charities this year being Wigan and Leigh hospice and TalkFirst, a mediation charity. Her official consort for the 12 months is another Standish councillor, Terry Mugan, who was re-elected last month

The Mayoral Civic service will be on Sunday 16th June at 3pm at St Wilfrid's Church and all are welcome. There will be light refreshments afterwards.

Debbie, a mother-of-three, who is an authorised lay minister of St Wilfrid's Church, was first elected in 2019 and has been appointed as Wigan's Older Persons Champion. She continues to work for the NHS. She said: "I am very proud to be Mayor and to represent Standish where I have lived and brought up my children for 48 years."

SPIRE FUNDRAISING PAST HALFWAY POINT

The £500,000 fundraising appeal to restore the iconic spire of Standish's St Wilfrid's Church is more than halfway to its target – but time is running out to begin urgent repairs.

A fundraising appeal for Wigan's only Grade I listed building was launched in April last year after architects have discovered problems with the structure. It has so far raised around £280,000 – including a substantial amount coming from the church's own funds but with generous donations from people across Standish and beyond.

But time is running out to hit the fundraising target for the restoration – which includes mending the broken spire clock – as it needs to begin in February next year to prevent costs spiralling.

Rector Rev Andrew Holliday said: "We are so grateful to everyone who has donated to the Save Standish Spire Appeal. People have been very generous but we need more people to come forward to give towards these vital repairs.

"The community of Standish has been looking after St Wilfrid's Church since the building was built in the late 1500s and it is bound up in the history of the village. It is now our turn to ensure this wonderful building survives for coming generations and I have no doubt the people and businesses of Standish will meet that challenge.

"We have been advised that the repairs to the spire need to begin as soon as possible so time is running out for our appeal. We trying many ways to raise the money needed – including applying for grants – but donations from the public are vital for us to achieve our goal.

"Our own parish funds built up over decades to maintain the church will contribute to the costs, but the scale of these essential repairs means that we have to reach out across the community for support."

IMPROVEMENTS 'SOON' FOR ASHFIELD PARK

Upgrades to the play area, football pitches and footpaths - and a new outdoor gym - are on their way for Ashfield Park after years of pressure on Wigan Council.

Councillor Ray Whittingham has been given information that the improvements planned into a work programme - but no dates yet.

Enhancement of the facilities at Ashfield was part of Standish Neighbourhood Plan, devised by Standish Voice, and our councillors of all political parties have lobbied for some of the money from housing developments be used on the park for several years.

People who completed the council's 2021 consultation on how to use developer funds - called Section 106 monies - said improving Ashfield was a high priority.

Councillor Whittingham states: "After many years negotiating with quite a number of Streetscene officers past and present, I and a resident who lives close to Ashfield Park have finally received news of some landscaping of the footpaths in and around the park and a few other planned additions."

PUB PLAN FOR STANDISH CENTRE HOUSE

A Standish centre house could be transformed into a "high-class pub with food" if a planning application is passed.

The owner of the vacant home on Cross Street wants to refurbish the property by creating the hospitality venue and a self-contained flat on the first floor. The venue would have 30 covers with an outside drinking and eating area at the back, and would be open five days a week.

The planning application states that the upgrade would be done "to meet modern standards for a comfortable living lifestyle by creating a dwelling of modest proportions to the first floor and a high-class pub with food element to the ground floor with an external rear outdoor eating / drinking area. Careful consideration has been adapted in the design of the development so as not to adversely damage the environment visually, economically and ethically."

The hours of business at the pub, opposite Standish Library, are proposed to be: Monday: closed; Tuesday: closed; Wednesday: 11am-11pm; Thursday: 11am-11pm; Friday: 11am-11pm; Sunday: 11am-11pm.

PLANS FOR CAR WASH ON PUB LAND

Standish Voice has objected to plans to turn the car park of The Shamrock pub into a car wash.

A planning application has been lodged to clean cars on the car park of the closed pub on Preston Road, with bays for cars being washed, parking for drivers waiting their turn, water storage tanks and a small office.

The pub has been closed and reopened sporadically for the past three years or so.

UPDATE ON BRADLEY LANE BRIDGE

The final piece of highway infrastructure has been put in place at Bradley Lane bridge after traffic lights were installed there.

An increase in traffic – with more expected when a new estate is finished on Bradley Lane – meant the council agreed to traffic lights at the railway bridge and tunnel.

Standish Voice and Standish councillors are concerned pedestrians could be put in danger and new illuminated signs at each end of the tunnel now alert drivers to people walking through the tunnel.

We will be monitoring the situation as we still believe pedestrians could still be at risk from speeding drivers.
